Notes from the President

Our state convention is in Memphis on March 31 and April 1. Your Tennessee AAUW newsletter has information on the speakers and the agenda. March 23 is the deadline to register.

In February the Branch Board voted to purchase one of the \$100 bricks for the statue honoring Febb and Henry Burn. Purchasing bricks helps pay for the statue. Our brick will be engraved with 'Oak Ridge AAUW'. Individuals are encouraged to make donations to ETF Suffrage Coalition. We are accepting donations to help our Branch pay for the brick we are purchasing (see page 3).

We are holding a discussion about our Roane State scholarships, pending whether the Legislature passes the required bill to grant tuition to all community college students. Currently only recent high school graduates qualify. We are discussing redefining the criteria for our scholarship and using it to pay fees other than tuition. No decision has been made. Mayme Crowell is checking with Roane State to see what options are available.

Please plan to attend our March 27 luncheon where we will hear about human trafficking and what our Tennessee legislature is doing about it. See details elsewhere in this newsletter.

Lastly, it's time to select candidates for Branch officers for next year. The Board is acting as the Nominating Committee. Exhibit in Honor of Women's History Month Highlights Burn Memorial

The exhibit at Oak Ridge Public Library was designed and assembled by Mayme Crowell, Charles Jones, and Virginia Jones. The exhibit shows Wanda Sobieski who is heading the Suffrage Coalition's fundraising efforts for a memorial honoring Harry Burn and his mother Feb Burn. Harry Burn, at the urging of his mother, cast the deciding vote in the legislature making Tennessee the 36th and final state needed to ratify the 19th amendment. Thus, women's right to vote became law,
