The Official 2017 White House Christmas ornament honors the administration of Franklin D. Roosevelt, who served as the thirtysecond president of the United States from 1933 to 1945 and his remarkable journey to restore the faith of the American people. The ornament is crafted from shiny brass plated with nickel and 24-karat gold.

The ornament was designed using elements unique to the life and legacy of President Roosevelt. The eagle on the speaker's stand at Roosevelt's first inauguration is the inspiration for the main element of the 2017 ornament. The two flags below have 48 stars each, representing the number of states in the union during Roosevelt's four terms.
