The program, *A Perspective on My Air Force Career as a Woman*, will be presented by Dr. Megumi Vogt.

Dr. Vogt was born and raised in Oak Ridge. In 1996, she entered the Uniformed Services University for the Health Sciences in Bethesda, Maryland as an Air Force officer. She completed her neurology residency in San Antonio, TX and continued to serve as a medical officer for 17 years alongside her husband, Kevin Vogt, who retired from the Air Force in 2014. In addition to her clinical work, she also spent time assigned to the Department of Defense recommending policy for traumatic brain injury. She continues her clinical practice today with University of Tennessee. Knoxville. She resides in Oak Ridge with her husband and three children.

Oak Ridge Branch AAUW Membership Renewal 2018-2019

Dues for 2018-2019 are due June 1, 2018. National dues are \$59, State dues are \$12, and Branch dues are \$9, for a total of **\$80**. Student Affiliate Dues are \$18.81. Part of the National Dues are tax deductible: \$56 for Regular Members and \$16.82 for Student Affiliate Members.

Paid Life Members are exempt from payment of National dues but continue to pay State and Branch dues (\$21). Fifty-year Life Members are exempt from payment of National, State, and Branch dues, although some continue to make contributions. Dues from new members joining after March 15 cover the next fiscal year.

When you pay dues for the coming year, you may contribute to the following funds.

Educational Opportunities Fund ---- supports National AAUW scholarships, fellowships, and grants for women pursuing higher education. Contributions to this fund are tax deductible.

Local Education Projects Fund ---- supports scholarships for RSCC women students and other local educational projects. Contributions are not tax deductible.

Oak Ridge Branch Operating Fund ---- supports our yearbook, newsletter, meeting facilities, programs, and travel to conferences. Contributions are not tax deductible.
