**Burn Memorial** Market Square, Knoxville

The Burn Memorial showing Febb Burn with her son Harry was unveiled on June 9, 2018. This effort was led by the Suffrage Coalition that also led the successful effort to have August 18 declared Febb Burn day by the Tennessee legislature.

The final battle for women's right to vote took place here in Tennessee and might have been lost but for Febb Burn who persuaded her young son and legislator Harry Burn to do the "right thing" and vote for suffrage. The historic vote took place 98 years ago on August 18, 1920.

Febb Burn Day was celebrated in conjunction with the East Tennessee History Fair, sponsored by the East Tennessee Historical Society, on August 18 of this year.
